Dear Sirt

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War record of Christian Fast, who served in General Clark's Expedition.

The data furnished herein were obtained from papers on file in pension claim, W. 4195, based upon the service of Christian Fast in the War of the Revolution.

Ohristian Fast was born June 32, 1763 in Frederick County, Maryland. He was the son of Hichelas Fast, the names of his mother was not given. He moved when about ten years of age, with his parents to Monongahela County, Virginia.

While a resident of Monongahela County, Christian Fast enlisted in the spring of 1778 or 1779 and served seven months in Captain Jeseph Heel's company, Colonel Zachariah Morgan's Virginia regiment, was stationed at Boott's Mill to guard the frontiers. He served as a substitute for his brother, Jacob Fast, in May and June, 1780, one month at Jakad's Fort on "big Whitely" under Colonel Miner, and later served two months at the same place under the same colonel.

He moved to Fayette County, Pennsylvania, and enlisted in June or July, 1761 in Captain Michael Catt's or Catt's company to go on General Clark's Expedition down the Chic River, and while in a detachment under Colonel Laughry near the mouth of Laughry's

Creek, we was wounded in the left hip. The whole detachment was killed or taken prisoner by the Indians, and he, Christian Fast, was taken prisoner, carried to the Mami country and wandered about in the woods with them, until the summer or fall of 1782, when he made his escape and reached his father's home in Becember, 1783.

The soldier, Christon Fast, continued to live in Fayette County, Pennsylvania until the spring of 1816, when he moved to Orange Township, Richland County, Chic.

He was allowed pension on his application executed October 23, 1832, then living in Orange Township, Ohio. He died there June 25, 1841.

Ohristian Fast married August 1, 1783, Ann Barbara Mason. She was born September 9, 1767, place not shown, nor were the names of her parents given.

The widow, Ann Barbara Fast, was allowed pension on her application executed November 6, 1843, then a resident of Orange Township, Ohio. She died August 19, 1855.
