



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

Reference is made to your letter in which you request the Revolutionary War records of James and William Roark, both of North Carolina.

The Revolutionary War records of this office have been searched and no claim for pension found based upon the service of James Roark, under any spelling of the surname.

The data which follow were obtained from papers on file in peneion claim, S. 32495, based upon service of William Roark in the War of the Revolution. This is the record of the only William Roark found on file in the Revolutionary War records of this office. The surname was searched under similar spellings.

The date and place of birth of William Roark were not given, nor were the names of his parents shown.

William Roark enliated in Sussex County, New Jersey, served three months as private in Captain John Fleet's company; three months in Captain Mark Thompson's company; one month in Captain John Marfield's company; during this time he was in the battle of Millstone, also drove his uncle's team and hauled cannon balls. There are no dates of service given.

At the expiration of this service, William

Roark moved from New Jersey to the "Monongahela Waters", and enlisted in the summer of 1781, served in Captain Michael Catt's company, Colonel Archibald Lochry's Pennsylvania regiment in General George Rogers Clark's expedition; about ten miles below Big Minmi, had an engagement with the Indians, he was taken prisoner, carried to Detroit, then to Quebec, put on board a ship and sent to New York, where he was paroled, March 17, 1783.

The soldier, William Roark, moved from the waters of Monongahela to Muhlamburg County, Kentucky, where he lived about ten years, and in 1810, moved to Gallatin County, Illinois.

He was allowed pension on his application executed March 15, 1833, then living in Gallatin County, Illinois. He died March 4, 1841.


Reference was made in 1836 to a son and daughters of the soldier. We names were given, nor was the name of his uncle, those team he drove, stated.

One Michael Roark was a neighbor in 1833; it was not stated that he was a relative.

The papers on file in this claim contain no further discernible data in regard to family.
